# *<b>\*ONE HOUR TOUR\**

The following tour takes roughly one hour, walking at a fairly good pace and spending 5-10 minutes at each stop.

#### AFRICAN SAVANNA

- African Village: From the schoolhouse, watch for giraffes, zebras, gazelles and orynx moving across the savanna.
- 2. **Hippos:** These 5,000-pound nocturnal feeders spend most of the day in the water.
- 3. **African wild dogs:** View this pack of highly social canids in their African floodplain-riverbank habitat.
- Lions: The pride of lions is often found lying on the rocks which are heated.

## TROPICAL ASIA

- 5. **Elephants:** Look for the elephants in their barn or outside in the pool or elephant forest.
- Siamangs: You may hear the distinctive calls of the siamangs before you see this pair of lesser apes just north of the elephants.
- Orangutans: These highly intelligent, curious and powerful apes can be observed at any time of day, in their indoor/outdoor exhibit.

## NORTHERN TRAIL

- 8. **Wolves:** Approach these shy animals quietly in early morning or dusk, when they are most likely to be glimpsed.
- Brown bears and otters: Visit a naturalistic taiga environment where grizzlies live a longside a flowing stream and river otters play nearby.
- 10. Mountains goats, eagles and elk: Continue to the end of the boardwalk for views of these animals that would reside in the far north.

## TRAIL OF ADAPTATIONS

II. Tigers, sun bears and sloth bears: These endangered species can all be found along the west side of the Trail of Adaptations.

#### TROPICAL RAIN FOREST

12. Gorillas: Visit both groups of gorillas in the eastern outdoor portion of the Tropical Rain Forest exhibit, and look for the white rump patch on the younger ones—a way for mother gorillas to keep track of their infants.
