
Summer happenings at Woodland Park Zoo

Seasonal hours and admission fees

Summer programming and new seasonal hours begin a day early this year! Stop by the zoo on Saturday, April 30 and be one of the first to enjoy the zoo's summer offerings.

Take a walk among a variety of Pacific Northwest gardens and experience native North American butterflies in the zoo's new immersive Molbak's Butterfly Garden exhibit, opening this summer. Woodland Park Zoo's new exhibit emphasizes both the fragility and resilience of nature through the display of what many consider to be among the most beautiful of natural expressions: butterflies and flowers.

Visitors will learn about the biology, behavior and threats facing these winged beauties, and be inspired to take local and global conservation action for butterflies and other pollinators. An arching tent structure encloses a landscape of approximately 3,000 square feet, and nearly 500 free-flying butterflies will represent at least 15 species native to North America. The Butterfly Garden is free with zoo admission.

Summer experience 2016 programs

Programs are offered April 30 through September 30, 2016, and are free with zoo admission, except as noted. New Ambassador Animal Programs at the Alvord Broadleaf Theater! – 1:00 p.m. daily

Join us at our new stage behind Zoomazium and meet some of Woodland Park Zoo's animal ambassadors! Animals and keepers have been working together on trading a tasty treat for a natural behavior. You never know who you might meet-look for prickly Skyanna the porcupine scampering up a tree, dexterous Lucy the raccoon showing off how clever she is and many more. You won't want to miss this new experience!



Keeper Talk – 11:30 a.m. daily

Meet a zookeeper and learn more about animal care at Woodland Park Zoo. When you visit the zoo, stop by the kiosk to learn the location of that day's keeper talk.

Tropical Rain Forest Primate Talk – 1:30 p.m. Mondays-Fridays

Meet a keeper to learn about lemurs or colobus monkeys! How do zookeepers check a monkey's teeth? Tails? Tummies? How are lemurs adapted to life in the trees? Come and find out! When you visit the zoo, stop by the kiosk to learn the location of that day's Tropical Rain Forest primate talk.

Penguin Keeper Talk – 1:30 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays

Meet a zookeeper taking care of the zoo's dynamic Humboldt penguins, and learn how these endangered birds live at the zoo—and in the wild.

Banyan Wilds programs

Enter the tropical forests of Asia and visit the land of sloth bears and Malayan tigers. Watch keepers engage these rare animals and offer enrichment items such as toys or treats. Programs are offered daily throughout the day. See program board at the entrance to Banyan Wilds for daily schedule.

Tiger Gate Experience – 11:00 a.m. daily except Tuesdays

How do keepers safely work with big powerful animals? How do you get tigers to move over? Check their teeth and belly? Training is fun for animals and keepers alike, and keeps them both safe and healthy – come and see how it works!

Banyan Wilds Tour – 1:30 p.m. daily

Come to Banyan Wilds and join a zoo staff member to walk through the exhibit. Look for details of how people research and protect tigers in the forests of Malaysia, and how the zoo – and you – can help.

Sloth Bear Snack – 2:00 p.m. daily except Thursdays

Sloth bears love to eat insects, and they have a unique way of catching them—they suck the bugs out of their nest! How strong is that suction? Come and find out!

Raptor programs

Raptors In Flight – 11:30 a.m., 2:00 p.m. daily except Wednesdays

Here's your chance to learn more about birds of prey. Keepers will introduce you to our resident raptors while demonstrating their impressive flying and hunting skills. A must see!

Zoomazium programs

Zoomazium – 9:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. daily

Kids 8 and under and their caregivers love Zoomazium! The indoor, nature play space offers play and learning in a fun, safe and stimulating environment all year long. Here, kids can connect with animals, habitats and more through the natural

language of childhood—play! Crawl through a hidden cave. Climb a giant strangler fig tree. Enjoy daily programs for toddlers and older children. Free with zoo admission.

Creature Feature – 10:30 a.m. daily

Children can get up close with live, furred, feathered or scaly animals. Meet the star from a puppet story. Practice observation skills to discover who's in the Mystery Box. Design a play space for a curious creature and watch as it explores.

Shake, Rattle & Roar - 11:30 a.m. daily

Join the toddler dance party with fun animal music and shakers of all kinds.

Animal feeding experiences and contact opportunities

Family Farm Contact Area – 11:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. daily

Touch domestic farm animals and learn more about them in supervised areas at the Family Farm. Free with zoo admission.

Willawong Station – The Bird Feeding Experience – 9:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. daily

This popular walk-through bird feeding experience transports you to the world of the Australian parrot and the Australian grasslands habitat. Willawong Station is a fun opportunity for the whole family to get up close and feed birds in a controlled, safe environment while learning about responsible care for birds both in the wild and at home. The aviary includes approximately 100 free-flying birds, primarily small colorful Australian parrots. Free with zoo admission. Bird sticks: \$1 each, cash only.

Giraffe Feeding Experience – 10:00-11:00 a.m. and 3:00 -4:00 p.m. daily except Tuesdays

Get close to giraffes as you feed them on a raised platform in the African Savanna, and learn how you are saving wild giraffes. Due to appetites, giraffes might not feed. Cost: \$5 per person, cash only; children 5 and under free with paying adult.

Animal Encounters

Want a close encounter with the animal kind? Here's your chance to meet a lizard, snake or other small zoo animal up-close and personal. Look for the Animal Encounters cart!

More fun...

Historic Carousel - 9:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. daily

Enjoy rides on the classic, hand-carved wooden carousel horses. Cost: \$2 a ride, in addition to zoo admission.

Discover!

The call of discovery beckons! Join docents in an exploration of nature's balance and tools of survival. In these hands-on programs featuring exhibits, biofacts and funfilled games, you'll have an opportunity to pursue questions and passions. Plus, discover how you can help save wildlife by taking some simple steps. Swing by a discovery station and indulge your scientific side!

Bug Club (fee based) - All About Arthropods

Did you know that four out of five animal species that exist on earth today are arthropods? The arthropod group of animals includes insects, arachnids, crustaceans and the millipedes and centipedes. This year, Bug Club topics will focus on each group of arthropods, exploring their life cycles and adaptations through buggy crafts, snacks and outdoor explorations. You and your Bug Club friends will also connect and share with Bug Clubs at other zoos. Bug Club meets 10:00 a.m. – noon generally on the fourth Sunday of every month year round.

Parents' Night Out (fee based)

Dinner reservation? Check. Verified movie times? Check. Babysitter? Uh oh. Don't fret—let Woodland Park Zoo handle childcare for you. Kids ages 4-11 will enjoy a fun-filled evening with zoo staff while you enjoy a night out on the town. Parking: \$6.00. Parking is limited. Consider taking the bus, biking, walking or carpooling. Conserving resources is one more way to help animals. For bus service to the zoo, visit <u>www.metro.kingcounty.gov</u>.

Online ticketing: avoid lines and buy your general admission tickets in advance at <u>www.zoo.org/visit</u>. Discounts and coupons are not applicable for online ticket purchases.

Mobile app: search for the free Woodland Park Zoo mobile app for iPhone, iPad or Android in your app store. Use it to track your location on zoo grounds with GPS, discover more about animals and daily zoo activities, and share the highlights of your visit with friends.

Quarters for Conservation: Part of zoo admission and membership has always gone to fund conservation programs in the wild. Cast your vote for your favorite

conservation project at the Quarters for Conservation kiosks located at each entrance.
