

Woodland Park Zoo opens new home for butterflies to take flight

Molbak's Butterfly Garden opens July 2



WHAT: Woodland Park Zoo is excited to announce the grand opening of **Molbak's Butterfly Garden**. The new home for butterflies to take flight will open to the public **Saturday, July 2**.

Take a walk through the Pacific Northwest's gardens and engage with native North American butterflies in the immersive Butterfly Garden. The zoo's newest exhibit emphasizes both the fragility and resilience of nature through the display of what many consider to be among the most beautiful of natural expressions: butterflies and flowers.

An arching tent structure encloses a landscape of approximately 3,000 square feet, and nearly 500 free-flying butterflies representing at least 15 species native to North America. Learn about the biology, behavior and threats facing these winged beauties, and be inspired to take local and global conservation action for butterflies and other pollinators during an immersive journey through the varying habitats where these North American species are found.

WHEN: Opens: **Saturday, July 2, 9:30 a.m.**

Molbak's Butterfly Garden will be open daily from 9:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m., from Saturday, July 2, through Sunday, October 2.

WHERE: Molbak's Butterfly Garden is located next to Zoomazium. Enter through the West Entrance at Phinney Ave. N. between N. 55th & N. 56th Sts. Park in the Penguin Lot at N. 55th St. & Phinney Ave. N. or Otter Lot off N. 59th St. & Phinney Ave. N. Or enter through the South Entrance at N. 50th St. between Phinney Ave. N and Aurora Ave./SR 99. Park in the Hippo Lot at N. 50th St. and Fremont Ave. N. (located next to the Rose Garden).

INFO: The Butterfly Garden focuses on the life cycle and identification of North America's butterflies and on preservation and restoration of appropriate habitat for these pollinators. The exhibit will contain

approximately 500 butterflies representing several species from North America.

Exhibit construction was made possible thanks to generous contributions of individuals, families, foundations and corporations throughout the Pacific Northwest, and funding from the Seattle Park District. Molbak's Garden + Home generously agreed to donate the plants and landscaping supplies that will augment the butterfly habitat and visitor experience for up to 10 years. Molbak's Butterfly Garden is free with zoo admission.

Name a Butterfly: To celebrate the opening of Butterfly Garden, the zoo is offering the opportunity to name a butterfly in its new exhibit. Anyone interested in naming a butterfly can do so by making a donation of any size to the zoo's [Annual Fund](#) now through September 2, 2016. Anyone who makes a donation and names a butterfly will receive a digital certificate—perfect for sharing or gifting—and their butterfly's name will be displayed all summer long on signage just outside the exhibit.
