

Last Chance: Visit Molbak's Butterfly Garden *Seasonal exhibit open through September 13*



WHAT: Take one last walk through the Pacific Northwest's gardens and engage one last time with native North American butterflies in Woodland Park Zoo's immersive Molbak's Butterfly Garden. The last day to see the seasonal exhibit is **Tuesday, September 13.**

The zoo's newest exhibit emphasizes both the fragility and resilience of nature through the display of what many consider to be among the most beautiful of natural expressions: butterflies and flowers. Learn about the biology, behavior, and threats facing these winged beauties, and be inspired to take local and global conservation action for butterflies and other pollinators during an immersive journey through the varying habitats where these North American species are found.

WHEN: **9:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. daily through September 13, 2016**

WHERE: Molbak's Butterfly Garden is located next to Zoomazium. Enter through the West Entrance at Phinney Ave. N. between N. 55th & N. 56th Sts. Park in the Penguin Lot at N. 55th St. & Phinney Ave. N. or Otter Lot off N. 59th St. & Phinney Ave. N. Or enter through the South Entrance at N. 50th St. between Phinney Ave. N. and Aurora Ave./SR 99. Park in the Hippo Lot at N. 50th St. and Fremont Ave. N. (located next to the Rose Garden).

INFO: The seasonal Molbak's Butterfly Garden exhibit is free with zoo admission. Zoo open daily - Hours through September 30: 9:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. daily. Admission fees through September 30: Adult (13-64) \$19.95; Child (3-12) \$12.25; Free for children 2 and under year round. Active, retired, and veteran U.S. military and their families, seniors and people with disabilities are eligible to receive a discount and zoo members receive free zoo admission year round.
