## Rhinos Taj and Glenn turn 2 years old over Veterans Day weekend and will celebrate with an early birthday cake!

WHAT:

Woodland Park Zoo's male rhinos, Taj and Glenn, will turn 2 years old over Veterans Day weekend. The press is invited to watch the best buds eat a specially made birthday cake on Friday, November 9. The special treat will be a tiered hay cake adorned with carrots for candles and apples and yams—favorite edibles of Taj and Glenn.



The pair of greater one-horned rhinos happen to be the same age and were born only a day apart. Tai (pronounced like Tai Mahal) means "crown" or "jewel" in Hindi. He was born November 10, 2016 at San Diego Zoo Safari Park. Glenn was born on Veterans Day, November 11, 2016 at The Wilds, a 10,000-acre conservation center and safari park located in Cumberland. Ohio and operated by the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium. He was named in honor of the late astronaut and Senator John Glenn. The rhinos currently weigh between 2,165 and 2,300 pounds each; when fully grown, Glenn and Taj will weigh between 5,000 and 6,000 pounds.

The rhinos live in the new special exhibition, Assam Rhino Reserve, which opened in May. They are the very first rhinos to live at Woodland Park Zoo in the zoo's 118-year history.
