
Calling all wizards and witches! Night of Magical Creatures coming to Woodland Park Zoo's WildLights

You didn't think we'd forget about the magical creatures, did you? Visit the Alvord Broadleaf Theater from 6-8 p.m. to see Woodland Park Zoo's very own incredible creatures take center stage for the evening! If you're lucky, you might even see an owl.

Guests 21 and older can enjoy a selection of hand crafted local beer and wine and specialty hot drinks while cozying up under the covered outdoor spaces near the Rain Forest Food Pavilion or Pacific Blue Chowder House, which will feature a selection of house-made chowders, pizza, burgers, and hot drinks. ID is required to order alcoholic beverages.

Regular WildLights runs through January 5, 2019, 5:30 – 8:30 p.m.
