- The Seattle Sensory Garden, an addition to the zoo's Rose Garden designed for those with and without disabilities to enjoy
- Sensory tools available at both entrances
- A new zoo Sensory Map to identify quieter and less heavily trafficked locations

- New additions to the sensory toolbox in Zoomazium

WHERE: Enter Woodland Park Zoo through the West Entrance at Phinney Ave. N. between N. 55th & N. 56th Sts. or the South Entrance at N. 50th St. & Fremont Ave N.

TICKETS: Zoo for All: Celebrating All Cultures is free with zoo admission or membership. Admission through September 30: Adult (13-64) \$22.95; Child (3-12) \$13.95; Toddler (0-2) Free. Active, retired, and veteran U.S. military and their families, seniors and people with disabilities receive a discount. Zoo members receive free zoo admission year round. Parking: \$6 plus applicable state and local taxes.
