#### New! Meet Seattle's tallest baby

Come say hi to Woodland Park Zoo's adorable giraffe, Hasani! The baby boy was born in May, and immediately captured hearts around the world. Born with a deformity in his rear legs, zoo staff worked around the clock to come up with a solution to make sure Hasani could live a normal life. Giraffe lovers around the world followed along on Hasani's medical journey, from bandages to custom-made shoes, until Hasani's legs were strong enough to walk on his own. Now, Hasani gallops and frolics with ease across the zoo's African Savanna with his family. While you're at African Savanna, be sure to also check out the zoo's hippos, lions, patas monkeys, zebras and ostriches.

#### Coming soon: Sip suds and save wildlife at Brew at the Zoo

#### Hours and admission fees



Woodland Park Zoo is open daily except Christmas Day. Zoo hours October 1 through April 30: 9:30 a.m.–4:00 p.m. daily. Zoo admission fees October 1 through March 31: Adult (13–64) \$15.50; Child (3–12) \$10.50; Free for children 2 and under year round. Active, retired, and veteran U.S. military and their families, seniors and people with disabilities receive a discount and zoo members receive free zoo admission year round. Hours and rates are subject to change.

Who will you meet today? Kids and their caregivers join puppets to participate in a fun story that leads up to a visit from a live zoo animal. Watch the animal visitor to learn more and maybe even gently touch them!

Join a toddler dance party in Zoomazium! Toddlers and caregivers are invited to sing, dance, and play instruments to animal and nature-themed music.

Penguin Feeding Experience — 11:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. (or until the fish run out!) daily Feed the zoo's tuxedo-clad birds! For \$5, feed the zoo's Humboldt penguins a handful of tasty fish and experience these endangered birds hand to beak. Feeding is subject to cancellation due to weather or penguins' appetites.

## Willawong Station: The Bird Experience — 9:30 a.m.-3:00 p.m. daily

Travel down under to the world of the Australian parrot and the Australian grasslands habitat. Willawong Station is a fun opportunity for the whole family to get up close to birds in a controlled, safe environment. On weekends, holidays and school breaks, seed sticks are available to feed the birds for \$2 each (cash only). The aviary includes approximately 70 free-flying birds, primarily small colorful Australian parrots.
