


CITY NATURE CHALLENGE 2019

SEATTLE-TACOMA METROPOLITAN AREA – RESULTS!






OVERVIEW

Woodland Park Zoo and Point Defiance Zoo & Aquarium helped mobilize people across the greater Seattle area to join a friendly nature observation competition involving 159 cities across the globe!

City Nature Challenge asked:
Which city in the world can find the most species of plants, animals and other living things from Friday, April 26 through Monday, April 29, 2019?

Any observation made anywhere within the Seattle-Bellevue-Tacoma-Everett metropolitan area, which includes all of King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, counted towards our total in the City Nature Challenge.

Participants took photos, identified what they saw and uploaded them to the project on **iNaturalist**. Participants also helped one another by identifying observations in iNaturalist.


