



ORANGUTAN PUMPKIN CARVING

Orangutans are red-haired apes from the Asian tropical rainforests of Sumatra and Borneo. They are one of our closest relatives, sharing nearly 97% of human DNA—and the name “orangutan” comes from words in the Malay language meaning “human of the forest”. Orangutans are critically endangered now, mostly from habitat loss related to illegal palm oil plantations. Choosing foods and products made from sustainably-sourced palm oil helps to save their habitat: zoo.org/palmoil

3. Trace the design by poking small holes along the edges of the shapes using a pen or awl.
4. Cut along the edges of the shapes with a carving tool.
