



TOUCAN PUMPKIN CARVING

The **toucan**, a bird that lives in South America's tropical forests, has colorful feathers and a large beak! They use that beak, which can make up 1/3 of their body length, to peel and eat fruit—but they occasionally eat insects, frogs or eggs from other birds too. Their fruity diet helps keep their habitat healthy because the seeds pass through their digestive system and regenerate the forest.



To carve your pumpkin:

1. Print out the template below (resize if needed).
2. Tape the template onto your pumpkin.
3. Trace the design by poking small holes along the edges of the shapes using a pen or awl.
4. Cut along the edges of the shapes with a carving tool.
