WHAT: Woodland Park Zoo is hosting "Color Life Happy," a special one-month art exhibit to benefit children participating in Seattle Children's Hospital mental health programs and Woodland Park Zoo's Saving Species Impact Fund.

The [collection by artist PaTan](#) includes 14 original art pieces featuring endangered or threatened species. The art is made from upcycled crayons that the hospital is unable to sanitize for re-use because of the paper.

WHERE: "Color Life Happy" is available to see with zoo admission at Woodland Park Zoo in the Briar Oak barn. Enter through the zoo's West Entrance at Phinney Ave. N. between N. 55th & N. 56th Sts.
