forest.

Healthy forests are nature's solution to climate change and provide habitat for wildlife and livelihoods for people. Guests will be empowered to contribute to conservation by learning forest-friendly consumer choices they can make daily at home, in the office, at school, during a zoo visit, in their community, and at the polls—to make lasting and impactful change.

Woodland Park Zoo will construct the new exhibit experience in the heart of the zoo's 92-acre urban forest at the location of the former Day and Night Exhibits. Construction is planned for 2024. The exhibit is expected to open in 2026. The zoo is currently conducting additional focus groups to dialogue with diverse communities across the region during the design process.
