

Today kicks off the largest bioblitz on the planet! City Nature Challenge 2024: April 26-May 5

WHAT:



The biological census helps drive community science by encouraging everyone to find and document wildlife living outside their windows, in their backyard, on their windowsills, and in their neighborhoods and cities. Individuals can take this on or get the kids outdoors and make it a family affair. Nature enthusiasts can also participate online by looking through and helping to identify other people's observations!

Last year's Seattle-Tacoma City Nature Challenge set a record for the region with community scientists sharing 10,057 nature observations and identifying 1,437 species, showing the world the incredible biodiversity in the region's home turf.

WHEN:

City Nature Challenge takes place in two parts:

Observe!

April 26-April 29

Take and upload pictures of wild plants and animals

Identify!

April 30-May 5

Help identify what was found

HOW:

It's easy, fun and simple!

- Download the free iNaturalist app or access it on a computer.
- Take photos of wild plants, animals and fundi in the Seattle metro area. This can be inside your house, in your backyard, out your window or in your neighborhood.
- Upload your photos to iNaturalist from your mobile device or via your computer.
- Help identify as many observations as you can.

Through a collaboration with the Empathy Collaborative and feedback provided by south Seattle communities, the Seattle-Tacoma City Nature Challenge now offers supporting resources in Chinese, Russian, Somali, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
