After April 26, a limited number of tickets are available for purchase at Woodland Park Zoo gates during zoo hours: 9:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. daily through April 30, 9:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. daily May 1 – September 30. Ticket prices at all outlets will include a \$1 facility fee to fund maintenance of the zoo's concert facilities. One child 12 and under per paid ticket is admitted free. ZooTunes concert-goers can purchase up to eight pre-sale tickets per show. Tickets sell out fast, so purchase early!

Member pre-sale

Woodland Park Zoo members will have the opportunity to purchase ZooTunes tickets before the general public. The ZooTunes member pre-sale begins online only on April 24 at 8:00 a.m. Members will receive an exclusive pre-sale link by email and can purchase up to eight pre-sale tickets per show.

Reserved Seat upgrades

A limited number of Reserved Seat tickets are available for each show. Reserved tickets provide concert-goers with premium seating (chair provided) and special parking. COST: \$75 plus concert ticket price. Upgrades must be purchased online at <u>www.zoo.org/zootunes</u>. Reserved Seat tickets will sell out fast, so purchase early.

- OTHER: Beer and Wine Garden Enjoy a great selection of wine and beer during the concerts. The Beer and Wine Garden opens at 5:00 p.m. You must be 21 or older to purchase alcohol. No one will be served alcohol without proper photo I.D., regardless of age. Alcohol must stay within the designated Beer and Wine Garden area. Note: Alcohol from outside the zoo is not allowed.

Parking fee – Concert parking in zoo lots is \$5.25. Payment can be made by credit card using the pay kiosks in the zoo lots. Carpoolers can take advantage of reserved spaces—first-come, first-served—in the zoo's north lot located at N. 59th St. and Evanston Ave. N. Free parking is available at lower Woodland Park. For parking alternatives, see bike and bus information below.

Bike corrals – Biking or riding the bus helps to minimize traffic congestion and on-street parking in the neighborhoods surrounding the zoo. There is a covered bike rack located at the West Entrance located on Phinney Ave. N. between N. 55^{th} St. and N. 56^{th} St.
